Birds of prey exhibition — back by popular demand, the Orphaned

Wildlife Rehabilitation Society will showcase beautiful predatory bird species from B.C.

Fly tying workshop
 — fly tying is an art that
requires patience and creativity. Create an artificial
fly that resembles your
favourite aquatic insects at
the workshop.

fly casting is a challenging sport. Casting instructors will be on site to show you various techniques to improve your fly fishing experience.

The fishy station
 — find out more about
fish species that live in the
Fraser River and Georgia
Strait. Study them in onsite aquariums and collect
all of the salmon, trout
and rockfish identification
cards.

 Juvenile salmon viewing — the Seymour Salmonid Society will showcase some juvenile coho salmon that were raised at the hatchery last winter.
